

Political Socialization

the process of how people form their political opinions, influenced by outside forces

The **family** is the strongest factor of political socialization, followed by the **media.**

Suffrage: the right to vote


Link between education level and voting




Factors contributing to participation:



- Elections








Political Ideologies. . .


